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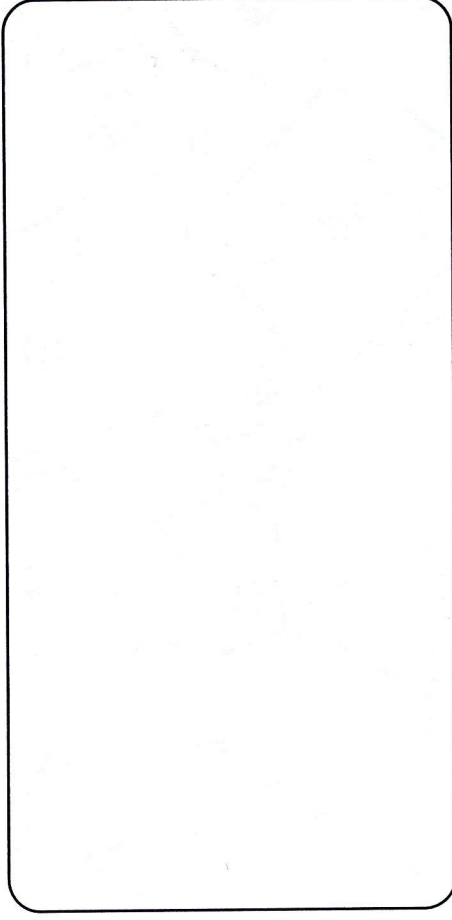

The type of science that studies rocks is called

Petrology
(rock) (science)

If we know what rocks are made of, we can learn about where they came from. We can also learn about the processes that made them.

Rocks are made of types of minerals. Minerals show different colors when they are under a special type of light.

Scientists take very thin slices of rocks and look at them under a microscope with special light. The slices are the same diameter as a piece of your hair!



The photos the scientists take are called
Photomicrographs
(light) (small) (something recorded)

The scientists use the different colors to determine which minerals a rock is made of.
